### Analysis

#### Persistent Absence

For children who are persistently absent parents have received letters and attended meetings to set attendance targets. Extenuating circumstances for vulnerable pupils have significantly affected attendance this academic year. In addition, term time holidays combined with illness continue to be the main cause of persistent absence. As a result, governors voted to begin fining families for term time unauthorised absence from September.

Termly meetings have been held with our Warwickshire Attendance Officer, with referrals being made to her for persistently absent children. In year 6, support was in place for a child with EBSA who was persistently absent. Significant work was undertaken with the family to support through early help.

For one child in Reception awaiting an EHCP a part time timetable remains in place. This significantly affects the overall percentage for disadvantaged attendance and has been omitted from the school average.

Governors are given a detailed analysis of absence at each half termly Full Governing Body meeting.
